Do angels exist? Are healing miracles real? Is there life after death? Can people get supernatural help from another dimension? Has the future been written in advance? Sid Roth has spent 25 years researching the strange world of the supernatural. Join Sid on this edition of It's Supernatural.

**SID:** Hello. Sid Roth. Welcome to my world, where it's naturally supernatural. My guest, **Melanie Hemry**, was a registered nurse. She happened to be one of these backslidden Christians, but she saw things that were unexplainable. I imagine a lot of doctors and nurses see these things. Melanie, what'd you see?

**MELANIE:** I saw a judge who was brain dead with three flat EEGs, who God touched. And not only was he healed...

**SID:** Wait. One flat EEG you're brain dead. He had three flat?

**MELANIE:** He had three flat EEGs.

SID: Ok. So he was dead, dead, dead.

**MELANIE:** Yeah. Nobody was home. And God touched him and raised him up. He not only lived, but he went back to try hundreds of cases on the federal court circuit.

**SID:** Then you saw someone who actually died before your eyes.

**MELANIE:** I did. I was taking care of a patient who had a brain stem stroke. She was in intensive care. Didn't respond to any kind of stimulus. While I was at her bedside, she had a cardiac arrest and her heart stopped. So, brain stem stroke, her heart's not beating, she's clinically dead. I saw this woman sit up in the bed.

SID: After she's dead?

**MELANIE:** After she's dead. I saw a look on her face like someone who's just seen someone they love, and she went "Jesus." Then she floated back to her pillow, and she was gone.

**SID:** What effect did that have on you?

**MELANIE:** I turned back to God real quick.

**SID:** I have your book here, "Anointing For Healing." I love it.

MELANIE: Thank you.

**SID:** The thing that I love about it so much is, in most of the cases, it wasn't an instant miracle. It was literally a fight of faith, and most people aren't aware of this. They can fight. They don't have to give up. They don't have to throw in the towel when they don't have their instant miracle.

**MELANIE:** That's the truth. Most people think if it doesn't come instantly that God didn't heal them, but that's not true.

**SID:** Let's talk to one of these people in the book, Wendy Moore who had Lou Gehrig's disease. Hello Wendy, are you there?

**WENDY** [via telephone]: Hi Sid, I'm here.

SID: Hi. Take me from the time you found out you had Lou Gehrig's disease, and what you did about it.

**WENDY:** Ok. I was diagnosed with Lou Gehrig's disease April 17, 2001. My youngest son was only 4 weeks old.

SID: Oh, how tragic.

**WENDY:** It was devastating. I had a 4 week old baby and a 2 year old little boy, and I didn't know that my children would ever grow up to know who their mother was. The doctors at University of Michigan Hospital told me I had two to five years to live, that I should quit my job, and basically prepare to die.

SID: I have friends who've died from Lou Gehrig's disease. Does anyone survive?

**WENDY:** No, it's a fatal disease. It's always fatal. Your nerves die off, which supply your muscle with the ability to function, and your muscles waste away. It's a tragic, terrible death.

**SID:** But you had an aunt who told you something you'd never heard.

**WENDY:** Yes. She told me that there were promises in God's word for my healing, and that I was going to live and not die and declare the works of the Lord. I went to Bible college and started learning what exactly God's word had to say concerning healing, and that healing was for me, and that Jesus was no respecter of persons, and if He'd healed one person, He'd heal me too.

**SID:** Now I understand, even though you didn't have your balance and you were literally coming apart at the seams, you determined to go back to work, working on an ambulance. Tell me about that.

**WENDY:** I decided faith without works is dead. If I was going to say that I was healed and know that Jesus healed me, then I was going to have to act upon that faith that I was saying with my mouth. So I decided to go back to work full time. Everybody at work stood in faith with me, along with my wonderful family. I didn't want a pity party, I wanted everybody to agree with me that the ramifications and manifestations of this healing would come. And that's exactly what I did. I carried on my life like normal.

**SID:** Two years later, what happened to you?

**WENDY:** It was actually two and a half years later. I had consistently went down to University of Michigan for about six months, and they would check me out. But the last time I went down, which was in August of 2003, they called me back and said "Will you come back down in October for a repeat EMG, with the same doctor who did your original EMG?" So I agreed to do that. On October 20, 2003, I went back for a repeat EMG. The doctors were walking in and out of the room, and asking me a lot of questions.

**SID:** Ha ha! I can picture that scene.

**WENDY:** They said "Did your mother ever have polio when she was pregnant with you?" They were just asking me questions. They said "You know, Wendy, you don't have ALS. We don't know what's happened here, but your nerves are trying to repair themselves." They said that my nerve endings look like someone who had polio 50 years ago, but they were not dying off anymore. That's what ALS is, the nerves are actively dying off. When they made the original diagnosis, they saw nerve death within 14 days of the test. When they did the EMG almost three years later, the nerves had stopped dying off.

**SID:** So what did the doctors have to say about this?

**WENDY:** They had to leave us alone in the room for about 30 minutes, because we were in awe. I had never felt so close, and felt God's presence... It was an overwhelming feeling, like God had answered our prayers exactly how we'd asked Him to answer them. We stood in faith and trusted Him and acted upon His word.

SID: But Wendy, what did the doctors say?

**WENDY:** They said it's a miracle. The doctor came in and told my mom and dad "You just got your daughter back. We have never been able to tell anybody this, but you just got your daughter back." And they were crying. They were absolutely devastated. They'd never seen anything like it.

**SID:** But Wendy, don't you understand that the disease you had is a death sentence?

**WENDY:** Absolutely I do. I've seen so many people who've since died from Lou Gehrig's disease, and I'm here today proclaiming the works of the Lord.

**SID:** Do you believe everyone can experience healing that follows what you followed?

**WENDY:** Absolutely.

**SID:** I am so glad, Wendy, that you're in the book. I'm sorry, because of time, I'm going to have to say goodbye to you now. Melanie, there are so many stories like this, and so well documented. I can't wait to get to some of the others. We'll be right back after this word.

We'll be right back to It's Supernatural.

We now return to It's Supernatural.

**SID:** Hello, Sid Roth here with Melanie Hemry. I am so excited about these documented miracles. For instance, I've got 23 pages here of a man by the name of Desmond Ooman. Desmond was a 4 year old boy. Listen to this medical report. How would you have liked to have been his parents? "He has a grave" - that's the word in the medical report - "a grave form of autism. Absolutely no involvement to the world around him." Then it goes on to say "He must learn to live with it. This will never be able to heal again." Melanie, this is such an amazing story. There's so many people that have either hopeless situations that are watching us right now, or children with autism. What type of bizarre activity did he do?

**MELANIE:** He was uncontrollable. He rarely slept. He banged his head against the wall for hours at a time. He had obsessive... He didn't speak much, but he would go obsessively "I am Desmond, I am Desmond..." He would scream, he would spit his food. The stress of trying to raise this child almost destroyed the family.

**SID:** You know the "before and after", we have the "after", as he's a grown up young man now. I want, in his own words, for him to describe what it was like to have this disease.

**DESMOND:** You must know that I couldn't really control what I was doing. It was something like... a human being with no purpose, just doing what it was "told", something like that.

**SID:** His mother got a hold of what the Bible had to say about healing, and she did the most amazing thing. Rather than her son just repeating for hours and hours "I am Desmond, I am Desmond", what did she have him do?

**MELANIE:** She taught him to say "I am healed, I am healed", for hours on end.

**SID:** The healing wasn't instant. Again, it took a while. One day he went on the school bus for special needs children, and he was coming home, and what happened?

**MELANIE:** When he went to school that morning, he'd been totally autistic, and when he came home from school, he walked up to his mother, looked in her eyes, and said "Why am I going to school with those strange children?"

**SID:** I like that word - strange children. He's saying those children are strange. In his own words, as he remembers this, let's find out what happened on the bus.

**DESMOND:** I was sitting on the bus. In the meantime, I was an autistic child. All the time I was thinking like a normal person. The first thing I mentioned was strange children, people laying on the ground because they had some kind of physical attacks you couldn't see. Very strange. And I was thinking about myself, why am I sitting in that school? I don't have such problems. I didn't think that I was heavily autistic, but nevertheless, I was healed, I think from that moment on. I stepped off of the bus and said to my mother "Mother, why are all the strange children at my school?" And my mother was very happy, and yes, I was too I guess. For the first time in my life, I had a social talk with my parents.

**SID:** I don't know about you, but to your knowledge, have you ever heard of someone with autism being healed like that?

**MELANIE:** I've never heard of a single time. That doesn't mean it hasn't happened, but I've never heard of it. It's become rampant in our society. This young man lived in Holland, and his mother got a hold of the word of God, and refused to let go of believing that by Jesus' stripes he was healed.

**SID:** I want to see a clip on his mother, his proud mother.

**ANNET:** Everything he couldn't do before, like riding a bicycle, like keeping his balance, like making friends and keeping friends and have a good social life - he can do anything now, because of God. There is total healing for every disease, whatever it is. It's not only for Desmond, it's also for everyone who's watching who is in need for a miracle.

**SID:** You've heard the phrase "All things are possible"? Well, this fellow with severe autism, do you know where he's enrolled right now?

MELANIE: In law school.

**SID:** Did you get that? In law school! You told me that the Spirit of God told you there were people watching that have hopeless situations. Would you speak to them right now?

**MELANIE:** There are people watching this show who, doctors have told you the facts. The facts are you're dying, but the truth of God's word is that by Jesus' stripes you're healed. Don't let go of that. In the spirit, it looks like the Grand Canyon, and you're standing on the edge of the abyss about to step over, and God's saying "Come away with Me." Step back. You don't have to die prematurely. You don't have to die prematurely. God wants to know you intimately, and His promises are available to you as much today as it was when Desmond was 10 years old and he was healed. There's also someone who's feeling very hopeless and despairing of life, and that darkness is like a ball of twine. But God knows which one to pull to unravel the whole thing. Don't give up. He's there for you.

**SID:** That's the message of your book, don't give up. Tell me about that fellow who was dying from... It was from Africa. A form of lymphoma. If fact, I think a lot of those records you have here are on him.

**MELANIE:** These are his medical records.

**SID:** Tell me what happened.

**MELANIE:** His name is Brian Wills. He was 22 years old, a professional tennis player, and he was diagnosed with Burkett's Lymphoma, which is one of the fastest growing cancers in the world. Primarily occurs in African children. Nobody knows why this man got it. It sometimes kills children in a day.

**SID:** This was about as hopeless a situation as you can get.

MELANIE: Right. He was diagnosed on Friday with a tumor the size of a golf ball. On Tuesday when

they admitted him into the National Institute of Health, it was 10 inches across, his kidneys had shut down, and he was given 10 hours to live.

SID: It doesn't get much worse than that. We'll be right back after this word. Don't go away.

We'll be right back to It's Supernatural.

We now return to It's Supernatural.

**SID:** Hello, Sid Roth here with Melanie Hemry, and we're talking about a young man who had everything to live for. He's starting on the professional tennis circuit, and all of a sudden, out of the blue, he has a form of lymphoma. Not just lymphoma, but from Africa, a very rare variety. He was given 10 hours to live. Tell me the rest.

**MELANIE:** He went to the Lord and said "What can I do?" and the Lord said "You have to follow My steps." He said "What are they?", and he said the Lord told him first and foremost that he had unforgiveness about somebody. Unforgiveness is one of the things that'll hold disease in place.

**SID:** That is a cancer, unforgiveness.

**MELANIE:** It is a cancer, it is! The Lord showed him this, and Brian said "I don't even know how to reach that person to repent to them", and a phone number marched across his mind. He dialed it from the hospital room at the National Institute of Health. Didn't tell the person "I'm on my deathbed." Just apologized, got things right, and his kidneys started working. I have the record right here where the doctor says "Kidneys have opened up."

**SID:** You've got the medical records.

**MELANIE:** The medical record. They couldn't understand why that happened. He didn't die in 10 hours, and he was still alive two days later, so they did another CAT scan of his entire body, and told him he was NED. I've got that here.

**SID:** What does that mean?

MELANIE: "No Evidence of Disease."

**SID:** I like that - NED. No evidence of disease.

**MELANIE:** By this time, when he had this CAT scan, it was in his liver, his lungs, all of his bones, and his kidneys. He forgave, and the Lord showed him he'd been lax about paying his tithe, and he paid his tithe. Everything started working, he had no evidence of disease. The Burkett's lymphoma, they could find no evidence of it in his body.

**SID:** But then they were doing an experimental chemo on him. Why did they do that if there's no evidence of disease?

**MELANIE:** The doctors used fear, I think, to try to get his parents... Like, "If one cell of this is left somewhere in his body, it could come back and kill him so quick. We're doing this research. It would help other people if he would go through it, so we recommend that he stay here and have this chemotherapy." He finally convinced them to do it, and Brian stayed and had this new protocol of chemotherapy for about 8 months I think. He went through horrible side effects: lost his hair, lost weight, fell out of bed and was too weak to get back up. Incredible things. But his family did what Wendy Moore did, and some of the other people in the book. They got the word of God and they just clung to it. They pasted scriptures on his wall, he confessed those scriptures...

**SID:** In Judaism, we're supposed to put scripture on the doorpost of our home. Under the new covenant, we should put it on the bathroom mirror so that every time we... Like I'll go in and shave, I see God's word about healing.

**MELANIE:** That's exactly what they did. They put it everywhere. He eventually lived, while everybody else around him was dying. When he went back for his six month checkup, they told him "We had never tested that drug before, and we now know that the drug is lethal. Everyone who took that drug died from the drug, except you."

**SID:** Everyone died except him. Why didn't he die?

**MELANIE:** Because he hung on to the word of God that said "By His stripes I'm healed." They kept praying and confessing the scripture, and the power of God's word was so alive it did more good than the medicine could do damage.

SID: That's quite a mouthful. Tell me about this book. What kind of feedback are you getting?

**MELANIE:** The feedback we've gotten is that people are getting hope. Most people think if they don't get an instant miracle, God didn't heal them. That's not the case. The people reading the book are learning that if you hang on to the word of God's promises... In the back of the book are all the healing scriptures you can stand on, and if you hang onto those, God's faithful. Just don't give up. That's the message, don't give up. Don't ever give up.

SID: Maybe you should change the title to "Don't Give Up."

**MELANIE:** That should probably be the title of the book.

**SID:** Something that you talk about a lot is the partnership - and that's the key, operative word - the partnership between God and man.

**MELANIE:** Right. We've all got a part. Everybody's got a part to play. Isn't it amazing that we're a three part being, we're made in His image, and we become His children, He wants to impart to us His authority. When Yeshua left earth, He gave us, the believers, His authority, and we can use that authority for ourselves, for other people. But literally, God's word, the Bible, is so full of life. The scripture is healing. The Bible says it's healing to your bones and marrow. Well Brian Wills didn't have any marrow left after all that chemo, but the word of God healed it. There is literally tangible power in the word of God, in the scripture.

**SID:** Tell me one more story from the book. These stories are so wonderful. They should be read to children at night. You should read them to yourself at night. Tell me one more that comes to mind.

**MELANIE:** She's a friend of mine in here, Anita Steeky, who at age 26 was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis.

SID: I've interviewed Anita.

MELANIE: You know Anita? Anita had been a classical pianist, and she lost the ability to play the piano, she became blind in one eye, paralyzed on one side, she couldn't hold her baby, she couldn't see her baby, she couldn't feel his face. The enemy was, she would be bombarded with pictures in her mind of her funeral, and her two sons are infants and her husband by her graveside. She determined to hang on to God's word, and she forced to change the channel in her mind. So every time that scene of her funeral would come, she would make herself see herself playing tennis, playing piano, running with her kids. And it was just like the other stories. There was never one day that she was instantly healed, but after about two years of this, all of a sudden she realized that gradually, one tiny increment at a time, she was well.

**SID:** So the story is, how can two walk together unless they be agreed? So she had pictures in her mind that were in disagreement with the promises of God's word, and she just aligned her thoughts with God's word.

**MELANIE:** One of the things that was hard for Anita is her mother was a Christian who had died of cancer. She had prayed, a lot of people had prayed. So Anita's like "Now I've been given a death sentence." The doctor said when she was 26 "All we can give you is a wheelchair and a catheter." She had to climb over the doubt and unbelief about her mother and get in the word for herself to hang onto it. And when that happened, the power of God healed the nerves in her body. They said "You can never have another child." Well, she did, and he's a teenager today.

**SID:** Healing is sort of like the game of baseball. Three strikes and you're out. That's what most people think. But, new rules. Kingdom rules. You can keep swinging at the ball until you hit your homerun. The only way you're out is if you take the bat and throw it away, and you give up. But God says all things are possible. That's a pretty inclusive promise.

## MELANIE: Very.

**SID:** All things are possible to those who believe. There are even people who are deaf right now, and the blockage is coming out of your ears. But the greatest partnership between man and God is to have the life of God inside of you. That means that He will never leave you or forsake you. When you die, you just shed your earth suit, and you're in the arms of Messiah. And when you live, you walk in your earth suit, in a healthy earth suit, and you fulfill kingdom principles. You must make Jesus your Messiah and Lord. My favorite prayer, I prayed it as a Jewish man that didn't know my left hand from my right hand about Jesus. Here was my prayer: Jesus, help! Except it was a whole lot more emotion than that. Jesus, HELP!!!
